THE CITY

Siem Reap town is small, quaint, and centred around the small river that runs through it. Right next to the river is the Old Town, known as the French Quarter, which is nestled around the Old Market.

Though Cambodia went through its own self-destructive turmoil under the rule of the Khmer Rouge (1975-1979), today the country is developing: roads are being built, electricity runs continuously, and streets are not flooded any longer. Yet, this new modernization has not spoilt the natural beauty of the Cambodian scenery, as farmers work in the rice fields, children skip to school, and palm trees dot the landscape.

In the city centre, you may lose yourself in the small side streets and browse through many small boutiques. At night, the area comes alive and the main street is full of people. Have a cold beer, enjoy a foot massage, or wander through the gift shops.

Even if Siem Reap isn't a big city with a lot to offer. Be inspired by the Apsara dancing, Khmer traditional art and the ancient temples surrounded by ancient trees in an eloquent collaboration between art and nature.

Transportation is readily available so feel free to visit whatever is on offer, as nothing is too far or too hard to access. The entrance to the Angkorian temple complex is just a simple drive away on a road magnificently lined with ancient trees.

Angkor Archaeological Park



This is the former capital of the Khmer Empire, which ruled this region between the 9th and 12th centuries. Angkor Archaeological Park

evokes the rich historical, architectural and cultural past of the Khmers. The majestic Angkor complex offers temples galore, which is a marvel to explore. Each temple is unique, from the grandeur of Angkor Wat to the beauty of Banteay Srei, this dynastic 'village' is spellbinding. You need a minimum of two days to explore.

As the temples are spread out, transportation is required. Bicycles, motorbikes, tuk-tuks and air-conditioned cars are at your disposal. Guides

can be sought through most hotels and guesthouses.

Tonle Sap Lake



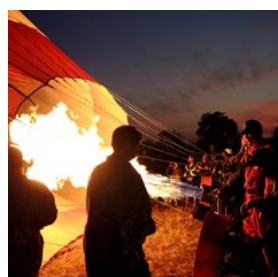
Tonle Sap Lake is the largest fresh-water lake in Southeast Asia. This vast expanse of water is at the heart of Siem Reap's past and present

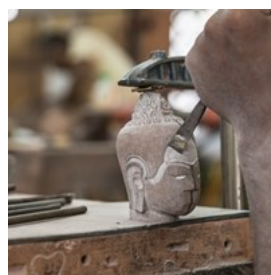

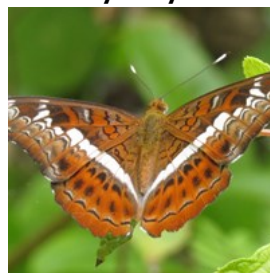
The Angkor Centre for Conservation of Biodiversity

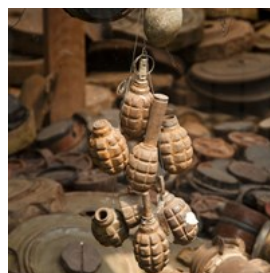
Banteay Srey Butterfly Centre

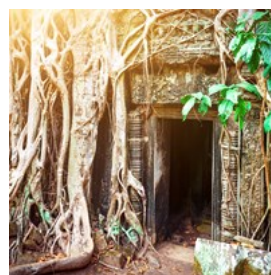
Angkor Thom

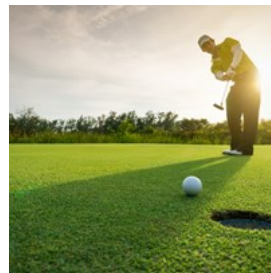

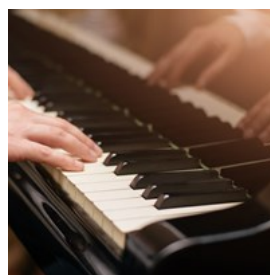

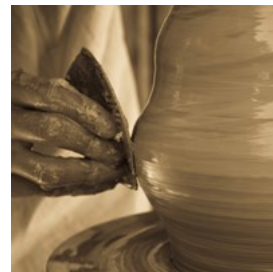

Passport / Visa



Visas for Cambodia are available at airports and land borders, and are easy to obtain for citizens of most countries. In order to obtain one, make

sure you can provide a passport valid for at least six months and a passport-sized self photo for your visa.

Citizens from the following countries will need to make advance arrangements for their visa:

Afghanistan, Algeria, Bangladesh, Iran, Iraq, Nigeria, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka and Sudan. Visitors from an ASEAN member country do not need a visa to enter Cambodia, as long as they have a valid passport.

Be aware that overcharging can be an issue at land borders with Thailand and Laos. To avoid that, you may want to arrange a visa in advance. Online e-visas are only accepted at Phnom Penh and Siem Reap airports, and at the land borders of Bavet/Moc Bai (Vietnam), Cham Yeam/Hat Lek (Thailand) and Poipet/Aranya Prahet (Thailand).

driver costs between \$5-10 and tuk-tuks between \$12-15.
