



WELCOME TO HEIDELBERG

The poet Goethe praised Heidelberg almost modestly as having "something ideal" about it. But Mark Twain, the pragmatic Mississippi river pilot, speaks of "the last possibility of the beautiful."

Today a city with some 160.000 inhabitants, Heidelberg was once the royal residence of German Prince Electors, and for hundreds of years it was a focal point of German history. Closely connected with Heidelberg are the names of such houses of nobility as Wittelsbach, Stuart, or Medici, of theologians such as Martin Luther, or political figures such as Friedrich Ebert.

Strikingly evident is the beauty of Heidelberg's setting and architecture: edged north and south by the forested hillsides of the All Saints' Mountain and the King's Chair, Heidelberg lies where the Neckar river leaves the Odenwald Forest and flows onward into the Rhine valley. The baroque silhouettes of the houses, the elegant sweep of the bridge over the river, and the stately ruin of the regal castle towering above the town, blend with the surroundings to present a visual image that is almost ethereal.

Amidst this magical setting, the town pulsates with modern life. In the angular lanes of the Old

Town, students, tourists, and long-time residents cross paths day and night. Numerous stages beckon citizens and passers-by alike to enjoy the annual festivals for classics, jazz, film, theater, and literature.

In Heidelberg's oldest university, founded in 1386, research at the highest level is being actively pursued. At present some 31,000 students are matriculated, roughly a fifth of the population. It is largely the students who vest the city with its cosmopolitan, international, and youthful atmosphere. Positioned in one of the most dynamic economic regions of Germany, Heidelberg is among the most attractive conference and convention sites in the land.

Heidelberg is considered one of Germany's most beautiful cities. The harmonious ensemble of Castle, Old Town and river in the midst of mountains was an inspiration to the poets and artists of the Romantic period, and has lost none of its fascination today for millions of visitors from all over the world.

The symbol of the city, Heidelberg Castle, lies some 70 meters or 230 feet above the Neckar on the hillside of Heidelberg's local mountain, the Königstuhl (King's Chair). The ruins of the Castle towering above the town are among the most impressive sights that a trip through Germany can offer the marveling traveller.

The city of the oldest university in Germany (founded in 1386, and since 2007 officially a University of Excellence) looks back on more than 800 years of history: from the former residence city of Germany's Prince Electors up to today's modern and future-oriented center of

knowledge and economic growth.

Heidelberg Castle (with the Barrel Cellar and the German Pharmacy Museum)



The Castle was erected on a medieval fortress complex high above Heidelberg. For five centuries, the powerful Prince-Electors of the

Palatinate region, members of the House of Wittelsbach, resided here. In 1693, during the War of Palatinate Succession, the Castle with its towers was destroyed. The magnificent ruins became the symbol of an entire epoch, the German Romantic period. Today during the annual summer Castle Festivals the Castle is an enchanting stage setting for numerous open-air performances.

The Old Bridge



Together with its famed Bridge Gate, which was once a part of the city wall, the Old Bridge has always been a symbol of Heidelberg. The statues

of Karl-Theodor (who built and gave his name to the current stone bridge) and of Pallas Athena, the goddess of wisdom and culture, stand enthroned here above the Neckar. The Bridge Monkey, re-erected in the 1970s on the Old Town side of the bridge, is one of the most popular photo motives. On the closest bridge column, below the statue of Karl-Theodor, are



chiseled the impressive flood markings of recent centuries.

Market Square with the Church of the Holy Spirit



One of the city's oldest squares, Market Square is framed on the east by the town hall and on the west by the Church of the Holy Spirit. In the center

of the square stands the majestic Hercules Fountain, erected between 1706 and 1709 as a reminder of the immense efforts required to rebuild the city after its almost destruction in the War of Palatinate Succession, 1689-1693.

The Church of the Holy Spirit was constructed from 1400 by Ruprecht I as both a collegiate church and a final resting place. The distinctive feature of the church is its loft galleries, where originally the famed Bibliotheca Palatina was housed as a safely enchained library, until its abduction and transport to the Vatican during the Thirty Years' War. Today the Church of the Holy Spirit is the city's main Protestant church and attracts visitors in large numbers to its concerts and church services.

Kornmarkt with Madonna statue



The Madonna statue on Kornmarkt was erected in the course of recatholisation efforts under Prince Elector Karl Philipp. Created by Peter

von den Branden in 1718, the Corn Market
Madonna is considered the most beautiful
baroque statue in Heidelberg. On the western
side of the Kornmarkt stands the stately Palais
Prince Carl - from 1788 an inn, till 1915 one of
Heidelberg's leading hotels, today an event
venue with a magnificent Mirror Hall - and on
the far eastern corner is the pale yellow house of
the French Count de Graimberg. Charles de
Graimberg became by his own volition and
immense efforts the conservator of the castle
and the founder of the city's art collections.
Graimberg died in 1864, having lived to see his
dream of preserving the castle come true.

The Old University



In the Alte Aula, the hallowed old lecture hall of the Old University building, famous graduate students have defended their doctoral

theses and received their degrees for some 300 years. Today the Alte Aula is the ceremonial hall of Heidelberg University. Mural paintings on the



ceiling and front wall of the wood-panelled room represent the history of Germany's oldest university. On the ground floor of the building, the three exhibition rooms of the University Museum trace in pictures, documents and German texts the history of the University.

Philosophenweg (Philosophers' Walk)



Philosophers' Walk is considered one of the most beautiful walkways in all Europe. The famed pathway that meanders along the sunny side of

the Heiligenberg has inspired countless scholars and poets through the centuries, and today offers visitors an unimpaired view of the castle and town, as well as numerous benches on which to linger and enjoy the matchless panorama. Above Philosophers' Walk is the Heiligenberg, 439 meters or 1,440 feet above sea level. On its the many footpaths, visitors can explore the still partially preserved celtic ring wall, the Roman Temple of Mercury, from the Mithra cult, the Thingstätte – a gigantic open-air stage from the time of National Socialism – and the ruins of the monasteries of St. Michael and St. Stephan.

The engraved love locks seal the eternal love of couples. According to an old tradition, couples close the lock together and throw the key into the river.

The view through the love stone opens up a unique photographic perspective of the romantic landmark of the city - Heidelberg Castle.

Apotheken-Museum

You will first receive an unobstructed view of the "Stage Heidelberg". Let your gaze wander up to take in the Romantic Castle, majestically

towering above Karlsplatz (Carl's Square). This is followed by a comfortable City and Castle Sightseeing Tour with a tourist guide along the River Neckar to a photo stop at the Alte Brücke (Old Bridge). Later, you will see Heidelberg Castle close up, with an outdoor tour in which your tourist guide will introduce you to the history

of this fascinating building. You will see the inner courtyard and the famous Large Barrel. After the tour, you can visit the Deutsches

(German Pharmacy Museum) and then enjoy the ride with the funicular railway back to the Old Town (valley station Kornmarkt (Grain Square)), which is included in the Castle ticket.

Parks and Gardens



Those who are looking for a place to relax in the fresh air in between will find a nice place in one of the public parks. Here is a selection of "green

oases":

Castle Garden

The geometrically structured terraces of the Heidelberg Castle Garden "Hortus Palatinus" were once considered the "eighth wonder of the world". The large grotto contained elaborate water features, its walls were decorated with stones, shells and coral. The large terrace offers an impressive view of the eastern front of the castle and the Rhine plain.

Neckar meadow

The 5 hectare Neckar Meadow extends along the Neckar River in the centrally located district of Neuenheim. Picturesquely situated on the banks of the river, you have a wonderful view of the old town and the castle from some places. The Neckarwiese offers an ideal space for recreation, games, sports and fun.

Philosophers' Walk / Philosophers' Garden
The Philosophers' Walk winds its way up the
southern slope to Heiligenberg. You can start the
ascent from the Theodor-Heuss-Bridge. The
Philosophers' Garden, located above
Albert-Überle-Straße, is a sun-drenched natural
balcony with a wealth of exotic plants. On the
natural balcony of the Philosophers' Walk you

can enjoy nature and the view of the city at the same time. Unprotected, the exotic plants thrive on this climatic island, which is one of the warmest places in Germany, and everything blooms weeks earlier than in the valley.

Swan pond / park in front of the public library
The swan pond complex is located near the old
town between Poststraße and Kurfürstenanlage
in the Bergheim district. Walking paths and
benches, fitness equipment and a playground
invite you to linger in the greenery.

Botanical garden

Founded in 1593, the Botanical Garden of the University of Heidelberg is one of the oldest botanical gardens: important scientific work by Heidelberg botanists is inseparably linked to it and its research and protective collections are of great importance. There is also a herbarium with unique specimens. The Botanical Garden is a place of teaching, research and protection of plants threatened with extinction, but also a place of contemplation and recreation.

HIKING TRAILS Quality hiking trail Neckarsteig The Neckarsteig is a hiking trail certified by the German Hiking Association. It is around

127 km long and 3127 metres high and leads

from Heidelberg to Bad Wimpfen, combining nature with the cultural and historical attractions of the region. The hiking trail offers very good continuous marking and is equipped with rest areas, hiking furniture and parking spaces for hikers. The individual sections of the trail can also be easily reached by S-Bahn or passenger boats. This makes the Neckarsteig ideal for multi-day hikes, individual day tours or walks

Wine and Culture Experience Trail Heidelberg-Rohrbach

Studentenkarzer (Student Prison)



From 1778 to 1914, the university's young students were briefly imprisoned here for minor offenses, such as willfully disturbing the

peace of the citizenry. Many of the inmates passed the time away by immortalizing themselves on the walls of the prison with drawings, silhouettes, and expressive phrases. Their spirited artwork can be admired today on a visit to the prison. A combination ticket is available for entrance to the Alte Aula and the prison (Karzer).

Prinzhorn Collection



The Prinzhorn Collection is the custodian of a worldwide exceptional body of work done by patients in psychiatric hospitals at the dawn of

the 20th century, collated by the art historian and physician of the Heidelberg Psychiatric University hospital, Hans Prinzhorn from 1919 to 1921.

The Prinzhorn Collection comprises some 5000 works, the majority in pencil or crayons, together with paintings in oils and watercolours, fabric art, and wood sculptures. 435 patients/artists, including some 80 women, are represented in the collection. They were mostly committed to institutions in Germany, Switzerland and Austria, and by and large diagnosed as "schizophrenic".




