The small cobblestone streets with old houses, and small alleyways with cosy shop windows in the old centre of the town are beautiful, and nostalgically decorated especially for Christmas, while more modern buildings will provide you with shops and stores for every need. The nature around Randers offers endless possibilities for activities on or near the fjord, and some historic and peaceful hiking tours will take you to the game reserve Sødring Vildtreservat where the fjord flows into the Kattegat - pack a delicious picnic basket, and enjoy nature and culture all together.

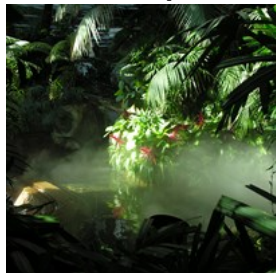

Randers Tropical Zoo



Randers Tropical Zoo features the largest artificial rain forest in Europe, with mirroring the three rainforest continents: South

America, Asia and Africa. Observe giant lianas, roaring waterfalls, and more than 450 different tropical plants, and 250 species of animals, and more than half of them walk around freely. If you are brave, you can also get very close to the snakes in the Asian snake yard, or to an armadillo or a green anaconda, which is the heaviest boa constrictor species in the world. For having a break from this wildlife experience, you can take it low with traditional Danish farming animals at the playground, or with a drink and a snack at the cafe.

roads used for the race are closed to traffic, so

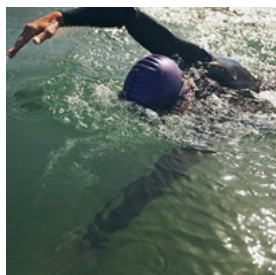

Denmark can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens of most European countries, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea,

Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend contacting the embassy or consulate in your country. International (non-Schengen) travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the Schengen zone. Citizens of Schengen countries can travel without a passport, but must have a valid ID with them during their stay.
