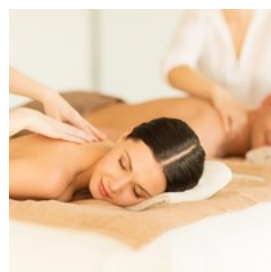
Rafting Nouveau Monde (New World Rafting)
